Year 9 examinations will take place the week commencing **Monday 28th November to Friday 2nd December**. These will only take place in the foundation subjects that are listed below and not in the core subjects of English, Maths and Science (these will be completed later in the Academic year). The table below identifies the date of their examination, what your child needs to revise and how you can support them at home with this. Most Year 9 foundation subject examinations are completed in the main hall unless identified on the timetable. Examination times range from 45 -60 minutes.

History (Hall)	<p>You should revise the Inter-War years topics and the start of WW2 up to and including the Battle of Britain.</p> <p>Topics include:</p> <p>Political ideologies (your understanding of left wing and right-wing politics)</p> <p>The rise of dictators in the 1920s and 1930s, including the rise to power of Hitler</p> <p>Impacts on Germany during the interwar years from 1918-1939</p> <p>WW2 learning so far</p>	<p>Use your exercise books to help you along with your learning journey and your history skills sheet. You will be assessed on a range of historical skills as well as your knowledge of historical facts.</p>
Geography (Hall)	<p>Fascinating places (year 9 learning)</p> <p>You should also rehearse your geography skills such as Map Skills, TEA, SEE, analysing graphs and so on. There will be some questions on your paper that are skills based.</p>	<p>Use the Geography learning journeys and your skills sheets (stuck in your book) to remind yourself of the content and skills studied.</p>
Music (Classroom)	<p><u>Song writing Task</u></p> <p>You should be working on song lyrics, with melodies (spoken, sung or rapped).
